Chapter 2 Champion Your Pastor's Humanity

Jeremiah 3: 15 And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.

Introduction: You have a pastor! If you were asked what their uniform looks like, none would say it had a Superman feel to it, but often we have expectations that pastors will have lives of steel, unshakeable faith, and be able to figure any and every problem out "faster than a speeding bullet". As members, we can often elevate our pastors to near God-like status and then crucify them when they have human frailties. Yes, pastors should stand as an example of strong faith, strong prayer life, and strong devotion to God. However, they are not THE example. Only Christ is the perfect example of perfection. With that in mind, let's study how we can champion our pastor's humanity.

Humanizing Your Pastor!

Are you Authentic with Your Pastor?

One method for getting to know your pastor is through authenticity. Too often we engage in conversations with our pastors and others yet we are not authentic about ourselves. It would stand to reason that authenticity is at the core of all relationships. How can you help build a "real" church if you are not real with the church leader and do not give them room to be real with you? Example: When was the last time you talked with your pastor after a sermon and let them know, I understood/did not understand such and such part or I can totally relate to that because...? Or, have you ever asked your pastor if they are mentally, emotionally, and physically healthy and meant it without a judgmental attitude if they said they were struggling in one area?

Leadership Style and Giftedness

All pastors have their own leadership style and giftedness. Leadership and giftedness are often misunderstood. Leadership style is the personality you sense as they are "making things happen". Three main leadership styles are *charismatic*, *organizational*, *relational*. No person is just one style, however they lean towards one style. What type of pastor do you have?
