Chapter 3

Don't Pick Up Your Marbles and Go Home

Jeremiah 3: 15 And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.

Introduction: If you have ever watched children play, you will have at some point seen an argument. You will hear phrases such as "That's mine", "Leave me alone", "But, I want to do this", or the big one "fine, I quit". In each instance, we see the childlike behavior ruining what could be an enjoyable moment. The underlying problem in the phrases mentioned by children (and adults) lies in the central focus which is me, my, mine, and I. Those who so often focus on themselves rarely see the bigger picture nor do they understand that the enjoyment of play occurs when everyone focuses on the enjoyment of play. In the church similar actions must occur. As the pastor leads the congregation, members should not focus inwardly, but should focus on the group, the vision of the church, and the central mission of ministry. As a result, everyone finds their role and finds fulfillment as members of Christ's body.

Key Verse: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

¹⁴ For the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵ If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? ¹⁸ But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose.

- 2. Believe in the best intent of everyone
- 3. Give people the benefit of the doubt
- 4. Remember, it is not a competition. We win together and we lose together. 1 Corinthians 12: 26
- 5. Ask, "What would Jesus do in this situation?"

5 Keys to A Successful Team

- 1. Cooperation-We have been called to unity, which means we must work together and push The Mt. Zion ministry in the direction of the vision given by our pastor
- 2. Communication-Clear communication of the vision of the church helps people to know what to do. We must ensure that all parties understand their role and feel comfortable interacting with everyone. No cliques allowed!
- 3. Change-oriented-no organization that is growing remains the same. Support your pastor in pushing the church to grow spiritually, physically, and financially.
- 4. Contribution-Commit to fulfilling your total role on the team which includes, time, talent, and treasure.
- 5. Commitment-Your pastor needs you to be all in. This means you have decided to be 100% about the success of the ministry of The Mount Zion Church.
