INTRODUCTION:

Risk Taking Service-in simple terms relates to outside the norm actions we take in service for Christ. Whether it involves helping homeless people or at-risk children, risk taking always pushes us beyond our comfort zone. Additionally, risk taking always involves putting others first and has a component of sacrifice. In this lesson we will discover what it means to take risk in ministry and how Jesus blesses those who are willing to take risks for Him.


