<u>Introduction:</u> The following lesson will help students to understand the mandate Christians have to share the Good News that Jesus is the Christ and saves us from the penalty of our sins. This foundational lesson clarifies the "why" behind our role as mouthpieces or ambassadors for Christ. Salvation is available for everyone and we participate in the saving of those who are in our sphere of influence. However, we often forget that our role is not given as an option. We are commanded to share our faith with others. Why? Because Jesus said so.



Readings for this lesson:

Matthew 28: 19-20

These lessons are crucial because we often fail to teach people what it means to be a Christian in totality. We regularly explain what Jesus does for us, but we are not consistent in messaging to people what we must do for



Christ. This means that we merely help people to find salvation (at best) but we do not clarify the progressive lifestyle changes that come or the Christian disciplines which empower us to live in the way Jesus intends.
